Sacred Journey Breaks 11 Year Track Record at Bathurst!!

The champ of the month, yes you guessed it, it was SACRED JOURNEY. At long last after working hard on his mind set, we finally convinced him, (as I said last month) to sit, catch and pass. Well ridden by Patrick Murphy, SACRED broke an eleven year TRACK RECORD to win by a length over the 1400mt journey at Bathurst on the 21st. The week before he had a soft barrier trial at Hawkesbury and after running second, Patrick whispered he would be a good thing at Bathurst and he was. He is now out for a six week spell; we decided not to rush him for Scone in May. Look after the horse and they will look after you, is our motto.



Bathurst 20th January—Race 7—1400m Sacred Journey had a brilliant run with a time of 1:21:60 which broke the long standing 11 year track record of 1:21:62 held by Shady Lady. Click here to watch a video of the race.



The improver of the month was SHADE OF GREEN. We had a round table conference to agree she should have hands off for a week in the paddock after her disappointing run at Canterbury. This definitely worked, with her putting on a load of weight and freshening to her old self. Her first start back after her freshen, was at Wyong on the 16th. Grant Buckley rode and reported after getting a sit from the widest barrier and then taking off the last 600 to round the turn ten wide? (Guide em around the turn don't ride em.) "Draws a barrier she wins." well that would have been nice instead of a close fourth. Another talk brought about the decision to start her at Warwick Farm Sat 26th. Had she got the run sooner in the straight, once again she would have run second and not 5th, beat 2.5 lengths. However when all was done we have our horse back in the chase and she will have another run in three weeks time, hopefully for a win!



HAMBERG tried hard this month and was certainly not disgraced in his two starts over 1800 and then 1900 at Canterbury night meeting. "Just too far" Tommy Berry said, after we gave a big cheer at the 1800, but then they moved the winning post! He's out to spell and a decision will be made weather to give him another prep or retire him.

AUSBRED BENZ put in a good first trial at Hawkesbury on the 14th and will trial in earnest on Monday the 4th, at Warwick Farm. This trial will see him fit and ready to race in good form approx two weeks later, where?

BLACK PIRATE has made me eat my words after telling the owners he refuses to be boxed in the barn. Well, let me tell you, when the heavens opened over the past two days, we locked him up along with all his friends; no complaints were seen or heard from our black beauty. I say, he really has matured mentally and physically this time in. I can only be excited with his persona, knowing very well that his matured attitude will have a great deal to do with him being a much improved race horse. He will trial at Warwick Farm on Friday the 15th of Feb. Two perfect races appear after the trial, On Friday the 1st March at Goulburn and Saturday the 2nd March at Kembla, both over 1200.

APPLIANCES, our new comer will accompany BENZ to the Warwick Farm trials Monday the 4th Feb. He shows us plenty on the track so we hope it continues in his races.

SNIPAROSE and TOO CHIC returned to work on the 7th Jan, looking fantastic and going the same. Eight weeks of work will see them at a trial, Go You Good Girls!!

VENCEDORA has learnt his lesson of being up close and personal through an ample supply of carrots. When being led off the pony he was given carrots to persuade him to come closer. Now he chases the horse in front and tries to relieve the other rider of the carrots he thinks they may have in their pocket. WELL not quite, but if it works? He seems well over his phobia, but is still a nervy type, so a very good 'International Health' product is helping to calm him; it's appropriately called, Soother. His couple of gallops have been more than pleasing and his barrier manners are impeccable. We should get him to the trials later this month.

LORD ROW has joined us again after his set back and should trial at the end of the month.



We then finish them off for a week, trucking them to the track to get used to the routine and also to walk them through the barriers, before they go out to spell again.

The people cannot believe how user friendly they are. Not a lot of re-hab needed for our horses, they are happy and obliging, it comes from good care and mutual respect.
