## **MELBOURNE CUP!**

Next Tuesday the Melbourne Cup will be run for the 155th time. This mighty race began in 1861, when an enterprising young man named Frederick Standish, suggested to the committee of the Victorian Turf Club, to accommodate a two mile race and name it, 'The Melbourne Cup.' The idea was taken up immediately. So a seventeen horse field lined up in the inaugural event. One bolted at the start and took no part. Three horses fell and two out of three had to be put down. Archer, after walking 500 miles to take his place, in the race, won by 8 lengths. It's still the record for the longest winning distance.

Nearly one hundred years later, 1951, yours truly at nine, went hand in hand with Dad to the Cup. It was a scary business, I felt like an ant at a free picnic lunch. Needless to say I clung to the enclosure fence all day, while Dad ferried drinks and food to me. I loved all the colour and the excitement of the magnificent race horses, not to mention, the ladies dressed to the nines. I vowed that night, I would not return to the Melbourne cup, until I owned one of the Cup horses and I looked like one of those nice ladies. Well, what do you know, I've kept my promise! But it aint over till the old girl (me) carks it!!

TOO CHIC refuses to tap the mat! She is still with us in this long preparation. 7/10 at Canterbury, Chic ran the 1900 metres, running home well into 4<sup>th</sup> place.

29/10, Chic contended another tight circuit, Gosford, over 2100mts where after the race, the stewards report took up 10 paragraphs. I won't bother to fill you in, only to say the wrong decision was made at the 600, which subsequently lost her the race. Chic had more stops and starts than the Olympic's, entire track and field events. She's earned a holiday, although we're sure she would have battled on racing regardless.

Legistate will run again on, 5/11-Ladies Day at H.R.C.

On 11/10, Hawkesbury once again experienced heavy rain and the track became a ploughed paddock. Hence, the below standard performance of Vencedora. He travelled well when on the bit, but once off the bit and asked to chase, he floundered. However, he battled on despite'- and was only beaten 3.5 lengths. An honest effort I think. We were looking forward to perhaps another win at Kembla on 24/10, over 1400, but it was the first time Veni actually disappointed me and I'm sure the other owners. He ran 4<sup>th</sup> and maybe should have run 3<sup>rd</sup>? No excuses really. So he'll have another crack on his home turf in a 1500mt class 4, 'The Ted McCabe' handicap on 5/11, yes Ladies Day at Hawkesbury. I keep saying it, so maybe you'll decide to come and enjoy an eye full of lovely young ladies, all dressed to impress!




Cousin Brian, a happy part owner of Vencedora.


