TOO CHIC received her chance over 2400 mts at Warwick Farm on 9/9, running 3rd in dogged fashion. Take out the winner, Amelia's Star, and we find CHIC in a winning photo. The winner by the way, is winning her way into group races this spring, so keep your eye out. Back to Warwick Farm on 22/9, over 2200mts and once again CHIC contends a sit and sprint race that saw her run 4 lengths 6th, a good effort considering this tactic is not her forte. Chic will probably have her final race, this prep at Canterbury on 7/10, but who knows? There seems to be a bottomless pit to her tenacity.

LA CHIC after finally breaking her maiden at Bathurst, started one of the favourites back at the same on 18/9, where the track was far from the heavy track she'd won on. In fact it was rock hard, plus she was placed back in distance from 1200 to 1100. A distance where speed is far more important than stamina. Hence the calculation of winning on a heavy track, which makes 1200 seem more like 1300-1400, then coming back to lightning speed on a fast track. Oh dear! I for one summed it up and thought it was not a bad run, when she passed over the line, 3 lengths from the winner. La Chic will race again at Bathurst on 9/10, over 1400mt.

SACRED JOURNEY had one to many bites of the cherry when contending another 1400 mt race at Kembla on 12/9. Sacred's sprint had left him after his 1400mt win at Bathurst two weeks prior. This Kembla 1400mt race was chosen because of the lack of suitable races and thereafter Wade again, had a struggle to find another race at the right distance. It was then decided because Sacred was extremely fit and well, why not have a go at the 2100mt race at Hawkesbury on the 24th. This race, I'm sure we all looked forward to, knowing if Sacred went to the front and did not make every post a winner until the final 600, when all systems go! He would stand a good chance in an average field of winning. After discussing the race tactics with Grant and him agreeing that leading was the right thing to do, he did the opposite and I will say no more, as I may incriminate myself. Sacred is now spelling in a lush paddock, with two ponies, whom he gets on with very well. He shall return to work in 4 weeks and it won't take long to have him up and racing again.
